15th Annual EPC a HUGE success!

The 15th Annual Elevator Pitch Competition will go down as a tremendous success. Amazingly, 124 students from 23 different majors entered the competition by submitting a 2-minute video of their pitch. Then, 75 reviewers helped to narrow the field to 16 finalists who went on to compete live for a shot at \$3,050 in prize money. Judges Colleen Albright, John Henne '89, and Dane Mossgrove '16 had the difficult task of selecting the winners from each category (commercial and social enterprise). Dorene Powell awarded the Social Impact Award on behalf of the Grove City Foundation, an affiliate of the Community Foundation of W. PA & E. OH.

The final round, held on November 10, 2021 in Sticht Lecture Hall, was well-attended both in person (over 150 attendees) and via livestream (550 viewers from 26 different states). Additionally, 282 individuals cast their vote for the Fan Favorite Award!

A very Merry Christmas from E+I!










Venture U. BUSINESS SEMINAR SERIES









In our Venture U Business Seminar Series, open to the entire campus, we were fortunate to be able to host experts from across several disciplines. This year, we learned from experts on *Building with No-Code Solutions*, *Securing Your First Customers*, the Art of Pitch Decks, and Financial Projections.

This Year...

Our teams learned about crafting and launching their businesses. Six students from three different majors formed four unique teams in this year's cohort.

In total, \$3,726.39 was awarded directly to the teams to help them meet milestones and test the feasibility of their ideas.

CHOW COW was able to speak to the founder of one of the biggest companies in their space. After the conversation, it was concluded that the need for Chow Cow was not great enough to continue.

SCOOTIE was able to secure a partnership with Grove City College to be the exclusive provider of scooter transportation on campus.

RESENSE secured their spot in the final rounds of three national entrepreneurship competitions and, after pivoting their strategy, was able to make strong connections with several care facilities.

SHARE PACKAGE created an MVP of their flagship care package for individuals experiencing homelessness.

Richard G. Staley '62 Visionary Entrepreneur Speaker Series



The Center for Entrepreneurship + Innovation's Richard G. Staley '62 Visionary Entrepreneur Speaker Series was endowed in 2013 by Richard G. Staley '62 to enable the Center for Entrepreneurship + Innovation to bring guest speakers to campus to explore topics related to entrepreneurship and innovation.

Mr. Staley founded Flavor House, Inc., a leading developer and manufacturer of unique flavors used by many well-recognized brands. He received the Jack Kennedy Memorial Alumni Achievement Award in 2019, an award presented annually since 1964 to alumni who have had distinctive success in their fields.

Founder Fireside Chats is a speaker series added this year as an expansion of the Richard G. Staley '62 Visionary Entrepreneur Speaker Series. The goal of Founder Fireside Chats is to provide students and faculty an opportunity to get up close and personal with a startup founder in a smaller, more informal setting.



Our inaugural Founder Fireside Chat featured Jake Loosararian '13, Founder and CEO, Gecko Robotics.

This event, moderated by Professor Yvonne English, packed Sticht Lecture Hall with students and faculty from many different majors. Jake shared the story of how Gecko Robotics grew from a VentureLab team and Engineering senior project at Grove City College to an international robotics powerhouse recently valued at \$533 million.
