



The Art of Leadership












This fall, E+I hosted Bill Strickland, Founder & Executive Chairman of Manchester Bidwell Corporation and a world-renowned social innovator, as part of the Richard G. Bill spoke about his life and the experiences that led him to build Centers for the Arts across the nation to inspire at-risk youth to achieve big things!

E+IFOUNDERS

The E+I Founders program is a unique subset of our E+I Fellows cohort. Members of the E+I Founders program are some of the most promising up-and-coming entrepreneurs Grove City College has to offer, and, as such, the application process for this program is highly selective. Once approved, student founders earn \$25 per hour for an approved number of hours per week (up to 20 hours) to work on their own startup. This program is designed to alleviate the need for early-stage founders, who may be pre-revenue, to take on additional work just to keep the lights on at the company they are building. In the fall of 2024, the E+I Founders program had one student founder participating.

Max Muncy '25, Co-Founder, Athletes After — As a co-founder of Athletes After, Max has spent the past three years building his startup to assist high school football players who want to play at the collegiate level but may otherwise not be recruited. Max's participation in the program has allowed him to focus his attention on Athletes After without the distractions of another job, which has propelled the development of the company's proprietary website forward. During the fall semester, Max and his team completed the website's development and beta tested their core products with prospective users. As a December 2024 graduate, this was E+I's last semester coaching Max, and we are excited for him to go out and do great things!

The E+I Fellows program was created to facilitate economic growth within the Pittsburgh region by placing students from Grove City College at startups, small businesses, and nonprofits that need their expertise. These students gain valuable, hands-on experience that they can add to their resume while earning \$25 per hour—the highest wage available for an on-campus job—while also helping organizations, that may otherwise not be able to afford their services, grow and thrive.

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


During the fall semester, our first ever 8-week cohort of the E+I Fellows program began. 116 host organizations applied to participate. Thirty-three student fellows working with 19 selected host organizations took part in this cohort, with overwhelmingly positive results, all with students earning \$25 per hour! Students worked as data analysts, supply chain managers, business development interns, web designers, marketing associates, event planners, as well as other mission critical jobs to help their host organizations grow. Students learned valuable lessons and gained in-demand skills that will help improve their future career prospects. The E+I Fellows program would not be possible without the support of the RK Mellon Foundation and another anonymous donor.
















18th Annual EPC our largest ever!

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The 18th Annual Elevator Pitch Competition was enjoyed by all in attendance. Participation was high with 169 excited students from 30 different majors entering the competition. Then, 75 generous reviewers helped to narrow the field to 19 incredible finalists who went on to compete live for a shot at over \$7,600 in prize money thanks to the amazingly generous sponsorship of Hudson Financial Advisors and NexTier Bank. This year's judging panel was expanded to include five judges: Jason Burtt '00 (Grove City College Office of Development), Lori Brinker '96 (Merrill Lynch), Dan Sumner (Westinghouse), Mitch McFeely (NexTier Bank), and Chris Camp (Fun Fore All). The judging panel selected the winners from each category (commercial and social enterprise), but it certainly wasn't easy. In addition, Dorene Powell awarded the Social Impact Prize on behalf of the Grove City Foundation (an affiliate of the Community Foundation of W. PA & E. OH), Jason Burtt awarded the Hudson Financial Advisors Prize, and Daniel Thompson presented the Commercial Innovation Prize on behalf of the Thompson Family Fund. The Thompson Family Fund also provided funds to increase the prizes for all finalists.

The final round, held on November 13, 2024 in Sticht Lecture Hall, was so well attended that an overflow room was required when over 300 individuals showed up to cheer on the finalists. 650 viewers tuned in online, as well. Additionally, over 525 individuals cast their vote for the Fan Favorite Prize!
